1 MR. STEINER: We'll go ahead and call
2 our meeting to order. We'll stand for the pledge.

3 (Pledge recited.)

4 MR. STEINER: Okay. We have two matters
5 of discussion in our hearing tonight. And the
6 first matter that we'll discuss would be the
7 application 4-13-15A. Bruce, could you read the
8 description for that?

9 ZONING INSPECTOR WAGNER: Yes.

10 Countyline Bar at the south end of town
11 wants to add an LED sign to each side of its
12 existing pole. And in essence it would fit below
13 the current sign as it sits.

14 They have been in contact with the
15 building department in which they directed them to
16 work with us first. In essence they are just
17 requesting to add an LED sign under their current
18 existing sign.

19 MR. STEINER: Okay. All right, thank
20 you.

21 Any of the folks that are planning to
22 speak this evening, please stand up and we'll
23 swear you in.

24 MULTIPLE RESIDENTS, of lawful age, were
25 first duly sworn and testified as follows:

1 MR. STEINER: Thank you. Okay, so could
2 you tell us a description in your own words of
3 what exactly you'd like to do there.

4 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: It's a two-by-eight
5 LED message sign. Basically it's going to going
6 to come -- you will see it from the north end from
7 the south side. And it's going to eliminate our
8 sign that we currently have that we put the
9 letters on.

10 We can more or less put our specials on
11 the Board up on that, I plan to put the time and
12 temperature, and basically just our specials and
13 upcoming events. So it's not like it would be a
14 ton of information up there, just trying to draw
15 some more people to the location and whatnot. I
16 think it's a three-line sign.

17 MR. STEINER: Like that picture?

18 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: Absolutely, yeah.

19 MR. STEINER: Okay, so it's a two-sided
20 sign but there's only one?

21 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: Actually it's two
22 signs.

23 MR. STEINER: Okay.

24 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: It's two signs put
25 together into a bracket, yeah.

1 MR. STEINER: Sandwiched.

2 MS. MYRLA: Is it a three-color sign?

3 MS. HIGGINBOTHAM: Yes, it's exactly
4 what's on there, the green, yellow/amber and red.

5 MR. STEINER: And so it will be below
6 the existing --

7 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: Right.

8 MR. STEINER: -- sign where it says
9 Countyline on it?

10 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: Yeah.

11 MR. STEINER: But it would eliminate the
12 temporary sign?

13 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: Yes.

14 MR. STEINER: Will it use the existing
15 pole?

16 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: That's my plan, to
17 use the existing pole, as long as it's engineered,
18 as long as an engineered from the sign company
19 stamps that that pole can withhold that with two
20 signs on it.

21 MR. STEINER: Right. That's all the
22 questions I have. Are there any other questions
23 from anyone on the Board?

24 MS. MYRLA: I guess I have two
25 questions.

1 In our book for digital display signs,
2 one of the requirements is that the message
3 doesn't change more than five times a minute.
4 Does that seem like something that would be at
5 issue for you or that you would be comfortable
6 with that?

7 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: Not at all, yeah,
8 absolutely.

9 MS. MYRLA: The other limitation on it
10 is they can operate during the business hours, but
11 not between 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. So obviously
12 that's not your business hours. So what kind
13 of -- ideally when would you like the sign to be
14 on would be my question?

15 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: Well, basically I'd
16 have the sign on whenever our other sign is on.
17 So sometimes it's off by 11:00 o'clock throughout
18 the week and on the weekends it's by 2:00 o'clock
19 in the morning. Then back on at -- I'm really
20 not -- I'm not sure how it really operates but,
21 you know, put it back on sometime in the morning,
22 6:00-7:00 o'clock so people going to work or
23 whatnot can see what our specials are for that
24 day.

25 MS. MYRLA: Okay. Did the company

1 provide any sort of kind of guidelines on how
2 bright this sign is? Because there is not much
3 lighting around there.

4 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: I think you can
5 control the brightness on it.

6 MS. MYRLA: So there is a dimmer that
7 you can control?

8 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: If I recall, yes.
9 Now, obviously I don't want to have it bright
10 blinding everybody either, so yeah.

11 MS. MYRLA: Right, you want it to be
12 bright enough for people to see, too.

13 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: Right.

14 MR. STEINER: Is it controlled
15 wirelessly?

16 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: Yes.

17 MS. MYRLA: As soon as installation of
18 the two signs that would be sandwiched, is that
19 when removal of the temporary sign would be?

20 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: Yes.

21 MR. STEINER: That was my question.

22 Do you have any more questions? Any
23 questions from anybody else on the Board?

24 MR. MOLEDOR: How close to the road is
25 that?

1 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: Oh.

2 MR. MOLEDOR: Want to make sure I
3 measured right.

4 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: I would say it's
5 six, eight feet off the road.

6 MR. MOLEDOR: How many?

7 DENNIS MAKAY: It's got to be more than
8 that.

9 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: Yeah, I mean, I see
10 it every day, but to put -- I can't really --

11 MR. STEINER: I would say it's a good 20
12 feet off the road.

13 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: Yeah, I'm sure
14 whatever the guidelines were to put it up.

15 UNIDENTIFIED: It's got to be at least
16 20 feet, at least.

17 MR. STEINER: It's set back in. Because
18 I just come from the south, or from the north
19 going south and really there's trees there and
20 stuff, I don't think you can even see it all that
21 well.

22 MR. MOLEDOR: Look on item 10.

23 MR. BONECUTTER: Five foot from nearest
24 edge of sign or roadway.

25 MR. MOLEDOR: Where do you see that at?

1 MR. BONECUTTER: B1, no, that's wrong,
2 I'm sorry.

3 MR. MOLEDOR: I have 9-10.

4 MR. BONECUTTER: It's still
5 free-standing, it's still a free-standing sign.

6 MR. STEINER: Any other questions from
7 the Board?

8 MR. BONECUTTER: No.

9 MS. MYRLA: Hypothetically if the Board
10 were to approve your variance and put stipulations
11 on your sign, the times your sign could be on to
12 the times that you gave me that you were thinking,
13 would that be amenable to you?

14 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: Yeah, absolutely.

15 MS. MYRLA: I mean, are those the times
16 that you really needed?

17 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: Yeah.

18 ZONING INSPECTOR WAGNER: Do you want to
19 swear me in?

20 MR. STEINER: Yeah, I don't know if you
21 have to.

22 BRUCE WAGNER, of lawful age, were first duly
23 sworn and testified as follows:

24 ZONING INSPECTOR WAGNER: I have
25 basically the road right of way down there, I

1 spoke with O.D.O.T. actually about the sign this
2 evening.

3 The right of way down there is only 30
4 feet, whereas up here at Friendship Acres it's
5 actually 66 at Friendship Acres. It's 30 feet
6 down south of town. So in that, the right of way
7 as far as I know O.D.O.T. has had no qualms with
8 where the sign is currently placed.

9 The only difference that might change
10 the sign location is if the building department
11 doesn't like the way the pole is in accordance
12 with the way the sign might be. But my
13 understanding is these things are pretty light.
14 So that's the only way this sign's position might
15 change, but indeed it is off the road right of
16 way.

17 MR. STEINER: Okay, thanks.

18 Is there anybody else that might have a
19 comment, even if you didn't swear in, I could
20 swear you in right now. No comments or questions?
21 Any other questions from the Board?

22 MS. MYRLA: I'd like to move to approve
23 the variance to Section 900.09, C1(A) and (E) with
24 the following conditions: That the sign be on no
25 later than 11:00 p.m. on weekdays and 2:00 a.m. on

1 weekends. That's all I want to say in my motion.

2 MR. STEINER: Any comments on the
3 motion?

4 MS. MYRLA: I need a second first.

5 ZONING INSPECTOR WAGNER: I'd like to
6 request the availability for the Inspector to ask
7 for adjustment of the lumens of the sign if need
8 be. That way we can -- in the longrun we can
9 somewhat manage if it's an issue on the brightness
10 we can have a little room to work with it, but not
11 dim it out to the point where it's useless.

12 MS. MYRLA: I'll amend my motion to
13 include the condition that the Zoning Inspector
14 monitor the lumens, the brightness of the sign and
15 discuss with owner.

16 MR. STEINER: That's in case any of the
17 neighbors might say it's too bright at night.

18 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: I do have a
19 question. You say weekdays, is that including
20 Friday?

21 MS. MYRLA: I would consider Friday the
22 weekend. So Friday and Saturday would be weekend,
23 Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday would
24 be weekdays. Is that what you were thinking?

25 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: Yeah. Yes, okay.

1 MR. STEINER: Okay, so we have a
2 proposal. Can we have a second on the proposal?

3 MR. WISE: I second.

4 MR. STEINER: Mark Wise seconds the
5 proposal. Roll call vote: Moledor?

6 MR. MOLEDOR: Yes.

7 MR. STEINER: Wise?

8 MR. WISE: Yes.

9 MR. STEINER: Bonecutter?

10 MR. BONECUTTER: Yeah.

11 MR. STEINER: Myrla?

12 MS. MYRLA: Yes.

13 MR. STEINER: Steiner? Yes.

14 MS. MYRLA: I was just going to -- if
15 the record could reflect that the temporary sign
16 will be removed once these two digital signs are
17 up. I should have added that to my motion. I'm
18 sure that that's your plan anyway.

19 MR. STEINER: So that puts that
20 application to rest.

21 MS. MYRLA: Well, I brought my umbrella
22 in. Did anybody else?

23 (Discussion had off the record.)

24 ZONING INSPECTOR WAGNER: I don't know
25 if the record needs to reflect this also or not,

1 but the power, the wattage on this sign says 143.
2 That's not that bright in my understanding. It
3 will be enough to cut the light in the evening,
4 but it's probably not going to be too offensive
5 like the Fred Martin car guys out there in
6 Barberton.

7 But, I mean, my understanding is that
8 should be close to what the power rating will be.

9 MR. STEINER: Are you looking on the
10 spec sheet?

11 ZONING INSPECTOR WAGNER: Yeah.

12 MR. STEINER: I think that's just the
13 current draw measurement, that's not the regular
14 like light bulb.

15 ZONING INSPECTOR WAGNER: Because it has
16 the amps and the 110 voltage, that's why I assumed
17 the power might be in the brightness.

18 (Discussion had off the record.)

19 SARA HIGGINBOTHAM: Thank you guys.
20 Have a wonderful night.

21 MR. STEINER: Okay, so let's have the
22 application number 4-13-15B. Bruce, if you could
23 read that one.

24 ZONING INSPECTOR WAGNER: Okay. This
25 was an application from the Friendship Acres

1 group, David Chalmers, the campground north of
2 town. What they want to do is where the sign, the
3 original sign exists, they have a temporary sign
4 out front as well as the original sign for their
5 place of business.

6 They want to put an LED sign with kind
7 of like a cultured stone or a brick-clad surround
8 and a little roof on it to replace where the
9 original sign sits and get rid of the temporary
10 signage as well as replace the original sign that
11 was there. So in that, the specs they want to
12 meet were somewhat relative to the other sign,
13 nothing crazy bright. But they do want to replace
14 both signs with one stone, fixed, solid sign.

15 And I also have the right of way spec
16 from O.D.O.T. and the current sign is well off the
17 right of way of 66 feet both sides or 33 feet from
18 the center of the road. So it's well off of that.

19 I think in one of the sheets I gave you
20 it shows where the sign was to be placed. So
21 that's basically replacing the sign that exists
22 there now.

23 MR. STEINER: All right, thank you.

24 How about if I swear in anyone that's
25 planning to speak on this subject this evening.

1 MICHAEL PITTINGER, of lawful age, were first
2 duly sworn and testified as follows:

3 MR. STEINER: Okay, start with your
4 questions.

5 MS. MYRLA: I kind of have basic
6 questions for this one. What's the area -- do you
7 have an idea of the area of the digital sign that
8 you want to put in?

9 MICHAEL PITTINGER: The reason why -- I
10 think we were good with 30 by -- Bruce, you've got
11 it. I should have brought my paperwork.

12 ZONING INSPECTOR WAGNER: My note says
13 32 by 85.

14 MICHAEL PITTINGER: 32 by 85. Basically
15 it's the same width as the sign we have now except
16 we're going to complete tear all that down.

17 MS. MYRLA: Now, the 32 by 85, does
18 that -- I assume you want to do something similar
19 to this(indicating)?

20 MICHAEL PITTINGER: I'm sorry, it's
21 going to be similar to this.

22 MS. MYRLA: So the 32 by 85, that's the
23 digital portion of the sign?

24 MICHAEL PITTINGER: This is digital and
25 this is --

1 THE REPORTER: I'm sorry, I can't hear
2 you when your back is to me.

3 MICHAEL PITTINGER: Oh, I'm sorry.

4 What we're going to do is put the
5 digital sign both sides and below will be, I don't
6 know what you'd call it, like a printed sign
7 that's fixed as well and it has little lights here
8 that shine on here, but not real bright but enough
9 to illuminate this part(indicating).

10 MS. MYRLA: What's the area of this
11 sign?

12 THE WITNESS: This sign is 32 -- what's
13 the bottom, Bruce?

14 ZONING INSPECTOR WAGNER: So round it
15 off to probably what I would call normal
16 measurements would be 36 by 91, three feet by 91
17 inches. And that would probably be the bigger
18 scope of the whole sign itself. The 32 by 85 I
19 believe is what one of the signs that was spec'd
20 to fit on the facade.

21 MICHAEL PITTINGER: This is here.

22 MS. MYRLA: So 91 by 32?

23 ZONING INSPECTOR WAGNER: 36.

24 MS. MYRLA: But you're talking about the
25 whole structure itself is 36 by 91?

1 MICHAEL PITTINGER: No.

2 MR. STEINER: 32.

3 MICHAEL PITTINGER: No, 32.

4 MS. MYRLA: Because I tried to get a
5 measurement off the digital and then this overall.

6 MICHAEL PITTINGER: This would be about
7 60-some inches tall, 64, 65 inches.

8 MR. MOLEDOR: That's the total height?

9 MICHAEL PITTINGER: Yes, sir, right from
10 here to here. This is the area here and then over
11 to that.

12 MR. MOLEDOR: This is there now?

13 MICHAEL PITTINGER: No, that's what
14 we're putting in. We're going to take down the
15 sign and --

16 MR. MOLEDOR: What's the total height
17 there?

18 MICHAEL PITTINGER: Total height here
19 will probably be about ten feet right here
20 probably at the most. We're still waiting on
21 because of the elevation, the way the grade is, we
22 couldn't -- the guy that came out to talk to us on
23 the masonry couldn't really tell the grade until
24 he shot the transit. But it would not exceed more
25 than, I guarantee, 18, 20, somewhere around there.

1 MR. STEINER: Now, I'm sorry, this
2 dimension here, that and that(indicating)?

3 MICHAEL PITTINGER: That's 32.

4 MR. STEINER: 32 inches tall?

5 MICHAEL PITTINGER: That's the overall
6 whole thing, that's not the actual illumination.

7 MS. MYRLA: That's the whole thing.

8 MICHAEL PITTINGER: And this also has a
9 control on it to where you can keep it, you know,
10 the brightness of it down as well as the other.

11 And this actually could end up being
12 smaller as well. We haven't gotten the total
13 thing. Like I was telling the gentleman, what
14 we're going to have, because of what the grade is
15 because it's different than what this sign
16 actually was in Edinburg, this might actually be
17 considerably smaller in height because the mason
18 says it depends on when he shoots the transit
19 where the grade falls. So he couldn't determine
20 that until he shot it.

21 MR. STEINER: Okay. All right. Are
22 there any other questions from anybody else on the
23 Board?

24 MS. MYRLA: What's the overall height?

25 MR. BONECUTTER: 12 feet less than --

1 MICHAEL PITTINGER: Yeah, with the roof,
2 again, that's undetermined because it depends on
3 what that grade is shot at.

4 ZONING INSPECTOR WAGNER: If I can just
5 inject an idea here, if you combine the height of
6 both signs, if they were indeed reaching 36 each,
7 that would be 6, plus the pitch of the roof, that
8 would be anywhere from 18 to 24 inches, plus the
9 base material, you're probably looking 8 feet, 9
10 feet at most, if you had 18 inches on top to
11 bottom.

12 MICHAEL PITTINGER: Depending on what
13 that peak comes out to, it could be --

14 ZONING INSPECTOR WAGNER: It's probably
15 going to be 8 feet width-wise. So, you know, 91
16 inches is just shy of 8 feet. So it could be 8 by
17 8 feet roughly, that would be the worst case
18 scenario.

19 MICHAEL PITTINGER: We're trying to keep
20 that actual stone section down as low as possible.
21 But we also know that because of the way the grade
22 is on that side that on a heavy rain the water
23 does come up.

24 And that's something we did not want,
25 because we're going to put flowers and stuff in

1 the flower bed in that stone-in area. So,
2 therefore, you don't want to wash them out either.
3 That's the problem with the other sign, it floated
4 out and started leaning. We've got to get rid of
5 those signs, they look bad.

6 MS. MYRLA: Our book says for any
7 planter sign, which this is kind of a hybrid, if
8 you will, that it shouldn't be more than four feet
9 tall. So you're not --

10 MICHAEL PITTINGER: No, heavens no.

11 MS. MYRLA: We're talking 18 inches, two
12 feet?

13 MICHAEL PITTINGER: Yeah, exactly. We
14 actually want to keep it as low as possible. The
15 thing is we don't want a sign being like
16 this(indicating), we want it more low.

17 MS. MYRLA: So you do plan to use it as
18 kind of a flower planter or plant bed?

19 MICHAEL PITTINGER: Just, yeah, small
20 flowers, nothing that's going to grow real high
21 because they'll interfere with the sign, but just
22 those short little flower things in there.

23 MR. STEINER: You mean landscaping right
24 around the stone part or on the inside?

25 MICHAEL PITTINGER: It would be on the

1 inside. Like I say, it wouldn't be anything
2 growing up because then it would cover the sign.
3 So it would be colored flowers in there.

4 MR. STEINER: Gotcha, okay. All right.
5 Any other questions?

6 MR. MOLEDOR: What about the hours?

7 MR. STEINER: What's that?

8 MR. MOLEDOR: Is it going to be on a
9 timer?

10 MR. STEINER: We have to cover the hours
11 of operation. Now, that sign, your actual sign
12 for the business is the one below?

13 MICHAEL PITTINGER: That's correct.

14 MR. STEINER: The one above is
15 information?

16 MICHAEL PITTINGER: Right. The current
17 sign we have now comes on at what time, right
18 about dark, and then it shuts off -- what time is
19 that one timed out? Or we can leave that one on
20 because it stays on all the time, it's illuminated
21 because it covers the campground.

22 The LED one, we could shut that off, you
23 know, at any time. But we would like to keep the
24 light illumination on the lower one because when
25 people come in at night to check in the

1 campground, they can see. The upper one, we can
2 shut that down the same as the Countyline, that's
3 not a problem.

4 MS. MYRLA: Do you often get campers
5 that would come to the campground after the hours
6 that we said, like 2:00 a.m.?

7 MICHAEL PITTINGER: Well, yeah, all
8 night long, 3:00 a.m. People travelling coming
9 off the turnpike and so forth or off I-76.

10 MS. MYRLA: So you truly get campers all
11 hours of the evening?

12 MICHAEL PITTINGER: Yes. When Mr. and
13 Mrs. Hankey had it they used to have the sign
14 across the street. And right after they had
15 purchased it from them, the lighting, the power
16 line had got taken out by a storm. And it was
17 unbelievable how many people would be calling
18 because they couldn't find the place. And that
19 sign was huge on two utility poles, but just
20 because it wasn't lit.

21 But we would not keep the LED one on,
22 just the one at the bottom a little.

23 MS. MYRLA: And you would use the LED
24 for events and specials?

25 MICHAEL PITTINGER: Right, same thing,

1 that's correct.

2 MR. STEINER: Okay. Now, is that events
3 like primarily for your restaurant there?

4 MICHAEL PITTINGER: That's correct, yes.

5 MR. STEINER: Well, I think according to
6 the zoning thing that we granted back in '08
7 that's supposed to close at 11:00 o'clock every
8 night anyway, right, the restaurant?

9 MS. MYRLA: Would you have any concerns
10 with being limited to changing the message no more
11 than five times a minute?

12 MICHAEL PITTINGER: No. We actually
13 went out to Edinburg, the Pedigrews(phonetic) put
14 one in and it was just like this. And we did a
15 study, we actually did a study on it. As we'd
16 drive by it you couldn't -- it was crazy. It was
17 terrible.

18 So even the sign people are telling us,
19 you have to keep it extremely lit low and limited
20 because too bright and too fast is not what you
21 want, unless like Bruce is saying, you're trying
22 to sell cars on 224, you know. Especially when
23 they are at eye level and they are not in the air,
24 it's at eye level and you want to slow them down.

25 MR. STEINER: Any other questions from

1 the Board? Any questions or comments from
2 residents?

3 GARY HARRISON: I need sworn in.

4 GARY HARRISON, of lawful age, were first
5 duly sworn and testified as follows:

6 MR. STEINER: Thanks, Gary.

7 GARY HARRISON: I was going to tell you
8 that I personally think that that sign would look
9 a lot better than the one they have, for the
10 township it would look much nicer. And digital is
11 here regardless. Thanks.

12 MR. STEINER: All right. Any other
13 questions? Audience, no?

14 Do I have a proposal?

15 MS. MYRLA: In a minute.

16 MR. STEINER: A proposal is being
17 prepared.

18 MS. MYRLA: As soon as Mr. Bonecutter is
19 ready I'd like to make a motion --

20 MR. BONECUTTER: I'm ready.

21 MS. MYRLA: -- to approve the variance
22 to Section 900.09 C1(A) and (E) with the following
23 conditions: The brightness of both the LED and
24 the external lights to be monitored by the Zoning
25 Inspector in conjunction with the business owner.

1 And also it would be contingent upon the
2 removal of the current signs once the new sign is
3 erected, and that the LED portion, excuse me,
4 would be off by 11:00 p.m. daily.

5 MR. STEINER: Do I have a second?

6 MR. BONECUTTER: I second.

7 MR. STEINER: Bonecutter seconds. Any
8 comments?

9 MS. MYRLA: Would you like to comment
10 why you would like it to be off by 11:00 p.m.
11 daily?

12 MR. STEINER: Well, that's the closing
13 time for the restaurant.

14 MS. MYRLA: Okay, I just thought the
15 record should reflect that.

16 MR. STEINER: Okay, roll call vote:
17 Moledor?

18 MR. MOLEDOR: Yes.

19 MR. STEINER: Wise?

20 MR. WISE: Yes.

21 MR. STEINER: Bonecutter?

22 MR. BONECUTTER: Yes.

23 MR. STEINER: Myrla?

24 MS. MYRLA: Yes.

25 MR. STEINER: Steiner? Yes.

1 MS. MYRLA: Next time I'll get your
2 back.

3 MR. STEINER: Okay. All right, so that
4 one passed with the stipulation. Any questions?

5 MICHAEL PITTINGER: We can leave the one
6 sign up until the other one is built and finished,
7 right? So we can order our sign now?

8 MS. MYRLA: Yes, you're not going to be
9 without a sign.

10 MICHAEL PITTINGER: Thank you.

11 MR. STEINER: All right. Any other
12 discussion for this hearing?

13 All right, we'll adjourn. I'll take a


